Table Fellowship

Fellowship is engrained in the wood of tables. Tables have not only gathered people together, but also connected them to one another. Stories are shared, bonds are created, and community is formed. It is the gift of table fellowship!

When we glance down at our calendars for December, we see all of the tables around which we will sit. We will give thanks around the table of communion in worship. Pulpit Banners

We are thankful for our pulpit banners, which we will begin to use this Advent. The artist, Reverend Lisle Gwynn Garrity, lives in North Carolina and was commissioned by the Memorial Committee to create these banners. Reverend Garrity came to Auburn FBC a couple years ago and created a live painting for us during worship. There are six pulpit banners that will punctuate the different seasons of the Church Year, calling our attention to the seasons of the life of Jesus and the rhythms of the Church.

The banner for Advent draws our attention to the star in the sky above Bethlehem, as we draw near to God. It marks the journey of Advent, as we travel each year to witness the birth of Christ. The banner sharpens our awareness of God's hope, peace, joy, and love, as we await the arrival of Emmanuel, or "God with us."
