"Love and Quasars"

He holds a PhD in experimental nuclear physics from Duke University, MDiv from Emory University's Candler School of Theology, and is ordained in the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. For three years, he was a NASA Faculty Fellow at Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Maryland, and he has also taught classes at Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta.


