### **Deacon Nominations**

It's that time of year to begin the process for recommending deacons for the 2020 Deacon Board. Following are the eligibility requirements to become a deacon at AFBC: (1) a person must have been a member of AFBC for the most recent 36 months, (2) a person must be 21 years of age or older, (3) a person must not have served as an active service deacon in the past three years, (4) a person cannot serve concurrently with one's spouse, (5) a person must have regular attendance in worship, shown leadership in programs of the church and willingness to serve when called upon by deacon officers and staff members.

Deacon Nominations can be made by completing a nomination form, found outside the church office and dropping it in the box by September 16th.


